## **February Events**

#### Open World Program Delegation — February 18

In collaboration with the Open Borders Program, we hosted a delegation of LGBTQ Activists from Ukraine. The event centered on discussing LGBTQ inclusion issues and connecting individuals together to learn from each other and create friendships.





### Why It Matters Conference Update — February 22

For the past two years, our office has been working in collaboration with the United Nations to establish the First International Academic Conference on the Sustainable Development Goals "Why It Matters". After 9 months of open calls for proposals, **52 UVU students and faculty/staff** have been accepted to present at the conference. Our office held a meeting to gather the presenters from our school. We gave a general overview of the conference, the conference program, opportunities for participation, and answered any questions individuals had. It was great to see everyone together for the first time!





## **Global Spotlight**

Global Spotlight is an academic and cultural program that is led by faculty in collaboration with our office. The goal of this program is to trigger global and intercultural engagement for students and community members. We encourage faculty to participate and lead an event of their choosing that will enhance UVU student's experience. Faculty may receive up to \$1,500 to help make their event a reality! The event must include an international component that benefits students directly. They must first receive department chair approval before submitting a Funding Request.

#### **International Mother Language Day Event** — February 23

We collaborated with the Department of Languages and Cultures to celebrate International Mother Language Day. **Sayeed Sajal**, assistant professor of computer science, organized the event and received funding through the Global Spotlight Initiative. Through that funding, we were able to provide food for 150 guests after the performances. The event centered on linguistic and cultural diversity and showed honor and respect to individual's mother tongue. President Tuminez offered the keynote address. Performances included poetry, dance, and music.







#### **Mathematics for Human Flourishing** — February 24
